- TRACK 1 Geared toward people who use data from the Census Bureau such as the 2010 Census and the American Community Survey along with other federal data providers. Learn about the latest data products, methods of access, and applications for the respective data products.
- TRACK 2 Geared toward GIS professionals who use Census Bureau data such as the American Community Survey data with Esri products. Learn about Census geography, selecting data sources, and joining Census data within ArcMap.
